




 - for the entire LSH cluster
 - not only focused on foreign investments

2. General business and innovation environment

- Ensure sufficient physical space: lab and laptop
- Keep working on: attracting and retaining talent, the international character of the city, cost of living, quality of life etc.
- Access to financial capital
- Good accessibility to health data
- Sufficient study programs (AI, pharmacovigilance)

Political and public climate concerning pharma pricing


